### EU values safety above free trade



- Romano Prodi made one of his first policy statements on food safety yesterday in the European Parliament. It may seem surprising that with such issues as East Timor, Kosovo, EU enlargement and the euro in the news, the
- Commission President chose this issue as one worthy of a major policy statement.

The pre-BSE approach to food law was articulated in the famous Cassis de Dijon court case which enshrined the "mutual recognition" principle whereby, if a food product was marketed in one member-state, it would be given free access to the entire Single Internal Market.

The EU has decided that, in future, enhancing food safety and consumer protection, rather than free movement of goods, is to be the cornerstone of a new EU regulatory regime for foodstuffs.

"The principle of mutual recognition, while preserving local, regional and national traditions, allowed the EU to realise an internal market without having to adopt hundreds of 'vertical' directives.13. However, even among European member states, which are relatively similar in terms of regulatory approach, national regulations cannot always ensure equivalent levels of protection. " (Alemanno, 2010 – see notes in this slide)

### The European response - (EC) 178/2002

- «EU General Food Law» Decision on our food safety «model»:
- «Risk» = A function of the probability of an adverse health effect and the severity of that effect, consequential to a hazard
- **«Risk analysis»** = A process consisting of three interconnected components: risk assessment, risk management and risk communication
- «Risk management» = The process of weighing policy alternatives in consultation
  with interested parties, considering risk assessment and other legitimate factors, and,
  if need be, selecting appropriate prevention and control options
- «Risk communication» = The interactive exchange of information and opinions
  throughout the risk analysis process as regards hazards and risks, risk-related factors
  and risk perceptions, among risk assessors, risk managers, consumers, feed and food
  businesses, the academic community and other interested parties, including the
  explanation of risk assessment findings....



### The European response – (EC) 178/2002

• Establishment of the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA):



"The Authority shall provide scientific advice and scientific and technical support for the Community's legislation and policies in all fields which have a direct or indirect impact on food and feed safety. It shall provide independent information on all matters within these fields and communicate on risks."

# EFSA – Questions (mandates) and replies (opinions)

- EFSA receives questions (mandates) from the Commission, the Parliament, Member States, and «self mandates»
- EFSA evaluates risks
- EFSA publishes «opinions»
- EFSA (risk) communicates



### **EFSA - Organisation**

- Management Board (EEA-countries are not representet)
- Advisory Forum (Norway is represented by the Director, VKM)
- EFSA national focal points (VKM is the Norwegian Focal Point) kontaktpunkt)
- Scientific Committee
- Scientific panels: Nutrition, Food Packaging, Food Additives, Chemical Contaminants, Biological Hazards, Animal Health & Welfare, Animal Feed, GMO, Plan Protection, Plant Health = 10 panels (there are Norwegian members of EFSA's panels and working groups.)
- Staff/employees (Norwegians can work in EFSA)

# VKM's remit – Food and environment: Cross-disciplinary interaction

 VKM carries out cross-disciplinary risk assessment within the food and environmental areas. Mandates from the Norwegian Food Safety Authority and the Norwegian Environment Agency - Two «clients» – Shared responsibility across different sectoral regulations






## EFSA – Detailed guidelines

#### Applications helpdesk -Applications helpdesk -Novel foods application procedure as Traditional food notification/application procedure as of 1 January 2018

when Regulation EC 258/1997 on novel foods and novel f presented a proposal for a new regulation on the matter. Th January 2018.

Authorisation and use of novel foods and food ingredients h An applicant who intends to place on the EU market a traditional food from a third country, may opt to submit a notification of that intention to the European Commission (Article 14). In this event and after having verified its validity, the Commission shall forward the notification to the Member States and to EFSA. Within four months from this date the have reached an agreement with the new Regulation EU 2015 Member State or the Authority may submit to the EC duly reasoned safety objections to the placing on the market of the a novel food should submit an application to the European Cc traditional food concerned. If duly reasoned safety objections have been submitted to the Commission the traditional food available to the Member States and mandate EFSA for a scient concerned shall not be authoriseed for its placing on the market (Article 15). In that case, the applicant may submit an opinion within nine months from the date of receipt of a valid application to the Commission including the documented data relating to the safety objections raised (Article 16). EFSA will issue an opinion within 6 months from receipt of a valid application. Such pocedure shall apply as of 1 January 2018.







### Reviderte rutiner som følge av «Åpenhetsforordningen»

EUs nye forordning om åpenhet (åpenhetsforordningen), innebærer blant annet at de som søker om godkjenning av regulerte produkter må følge reviderte rutiner. Forordningen gjelder fra 27. mars 2021.

Forordningen skal styrke påliteligheten, objektiviteten og uavhengigheten til vitenskapelige studier som EFSA legger til grunn i sine vurderinger, og styrke styringen av EFSA. Du kan lese mer om bakgrunnen for åpenhetsforordningen på EU-kommisjonens <u>nettsider</u>.

#### Verktøy og nettportal

EFSA har utviklet nye verktøy og en nettportal for å hjelpe berørte parter til å sette seg inn i og lære om hvordan de nye reglene som følger av «åpenhetsforordningen» vil fungere i praksis.

Verktøyene omhandler åpenhet, konfidensialitet, varsling av vitenskapelige studier, rådgivning før innsendelse av søknader, og høringer. 
